The Georgia Northwestern Technical College (GNTC) Foundation is a non-profit organization whose primary mission is to support students financially so that they can stay on course, graduate and enter the workforce. Ongoing fundraising enables the Foundation to carry out this mission. Donations are used to provide scholarships to outstanding students, emergency and gap financial assistance, program support, property and equipment purchases and faculty/staff development.

Response to the Pandemic

The GNTC Foundation sprang into action when the COVID-19 pandemic hit. A five-day internal fundraising campaign was launched to meet the needs of students facing additional hardships. As GNTC moved to virtual learning, the Foundation established a Laptop Loan program to put laptops in the hands of students who needed them. During this time, the Foundation also received an endowed gift that will ensure scholarship support for generations to come.

Turning Student Setbacks into Comebacks

- Over \$71,500 in scholarships and financial assistance was awarded to 264 students in Fiscal Year 2020.
- GNTC Foundation scholarships were awarded to 91 students totaling \$48,026.
- Emergency and gap funding grants in the amount of \$19,364 were awarded to 101 students.
- Awarded \$4,120 for GED® testing fees for 72 students.

GNTC 2020 Highlights

From HERE to CAREER! Academy

Catoosa County Schools held a commitment ceremony at GNTC's Catoosa County Campus to celebrate the first 16 students enrolled in "From HERE to CAREER! Academy." The Academy offers pathways in the fields of Industrial Systems Technology, Mechatronics and Robotics. The 16 Catoosa County students, representing all three high schools in Catoosa County, began the 2019-20 school year in dual enrollment to develop technical and professional skills for careers in our region. In December 2019, Catoosa County Public Schools received a grant award for \$3 million from the Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) to establish the Career Academy.



Industrial Career Day

Regional high school students and members of the community had a chance to speak with representatives of Georgia Northwestern Technical College's (GNTC) industrial programs, employers and former GNTC students about the benefits of learning a skilled trade during Industrial Career Day. The events were held on GNTC's Floyd County and Whitfield Murray campuses.



New Programs at GNTC

GNTC launched three new programs at the Whitfield Murray Campus in Dalton, Georgia including Automation Engineering Technology, Diesel Equipment Technology and the Flooring Production program. These latest additions are part of a major line-up of programs offered in the new 80,000 square foot campus expansion which opened in 2019.



Whitfield Murray Expanded Campus Ribbon Cutting

Georgia Northwestern celebrated the completion of a major campus addition with a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the new Whitfield Murray Campus Expansion on Sept. 20, 2019. Governor Brian P. Kemp was the keynote speaker for the ceremony that took place in the lobby of the 80,000 square foot facility. City, county and state leaders also were in attendance at the ceremony in Dalton. Governor Kemp said that the Technical College System of Georgia will continue to be a leader in producing a qualified workforce for the State of Georgia.

Gene Haas Foundation Donates \$22,000 to GNTC

Georgia Northwestern Technical College's Precision Machining and Manufacturing programs on the Floyd County and Whitfield Murray campuses were presented with a cumulative gift of \$22,000 from the Gene Haas Foundation to be used for student scholarships.



Bullock and Jones Named GNTC'S GOAL and Rick Perkins Winners and Regional Finalists

GNTC announced Adult Echocardiography student Christina Bullock as its 2020 Georgia Occupational Award of Leadership (GOAL) winner and English instructor Mandy Jones as the college's 2020 Rick Perkins Instructor of the Year. The pair were also named Regional Finalists for both GOAL and Rick Perkins Instructor of the Year. Bullock would go on to become the First Runner-Up for the TCSG 2020 Student of the Year. As the First Runner-Up, should the state winner not be able to fulfill their duties, Bullock would step in and serve as TCSG's student ambassador during a number of system and college functions throughout the year.



Paulson Creates Gingerbread Replica of Woodlee

After 90-hours of carefully constructing his 15th gingerbread display, Chef Greg Paulson, GNTC's director and instructor of the Culinary Arts program, put the final touches on his gingerbread replica of the Woodlee Building before moving it to its final destination on the Floyd County Campus. "It has truly been a labor of love," said Paulson, who has been making gingerbread displays of all sizes since 1987.



The Grainger Foundation Donates \$10,000 to Diesel Program

The GNTC Foundation was presented with a donation of \$10,000 from The Grainger Foundation to be used for books, simulators, supplies and fees for the new Diesel Equipment Technology program on the Whitfield Murray Campus. The Diesel Equipment Technology program teaches students the valuable skill of working on tractor-trailer trucks in a high demand employment market. After completing the Diesel Equipment Technology program, students will be able to inspect and repair buses, trucks or any other kind of diesel engine.



GNTC Program Director Honors Husband's Memory

Donna Estes, program director and instructor of Health Information Management Technology at Georgia Northwestern Technical College, has set up a scholarship through the GNTC Foundation to assist her students in achieving their occupational certification.

The scholarship is in memory of her late husband who was also a program director for GNTC's Computer Information Systems (CIS) program. "He believed in the underdog students," she said. "Charles always felt that no student should fall through the cracks."



GNTC Alum Starts Work at SpaceX

While his fellow graduates were walking across the stage in December, Georgia Northwestern Technical College graduate Dusty Powell was driving through Oklahoma on his way to the SpaceX headquarters in Hawthorne, California where he would begin work the following week. After five interviews with one lasting well over five hours, the two degree holding GNTC alumnus was ready to begin what he called his dream job as a Maintenance Technician at the aerospace company. Powell had already completed an associate degree in the Instrumentation and Controls Technician program at the time of his interviews last year, and wrapped up his second associate degree in Industrial Systems Technology at the end of the fall 2019 semester.



The Georgia Power Foundation Donates \$10,000 to GNTC's Foundation

The Georgia Northwestern Technical College Foundation was recently presented with a donation of \$10,000 from The Georgia Power Foundation, Inc. to be used to assist outstanding students with their tuition, books and supplies, fees and other needs. "Georgia Power is proud to invest in Georgia Northwestern Technical College's future," said Cassandra Wheeler, regional director for Georgia Power and Floyd County representative for GNTC's Board of Directors "We believe in making the communities we serve better, ensuring that partners like Georgia Northwestern have the tools and resources they need to prepare and empower Georgia students for future careers."



GNTC Students Chosen for National Scholarship Awards

Two GNTC students were among a list of national students chosen to receive scholarships from the American Rental Association (ARA) Foundation of Illinois and The Clifford H. "Ted" Rees, Jr. Scholarship Foundation located in Virginia. According to Rental Management Magazine, Cartersville's Lisa Matthews, who is enrolled in the Accounting program, was one of three students in the nation who received an ARA Foundation Trade School Scholarship. Through the scholarship, Matthews' entire tuition was paid for the fall semester at Georgia Northwestern Technical College. Gaining his second scholarship in six months, George News, Air Conditioning Technology program major, received a \$2,000 scholarship from The Clifford H. "Ted" Rees, Jr. Scholarship Foundation which is a part of the Air Conditioning, Heating and Refrigeration Institute (AHRI). According to Engineered Systems Magazine, News and his 48 fellow students, along with seven military veterans, received \$85,500 collectively. The scholarship was awarded to students studying to become technicians in the Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning and Refrigeration (HVACR) and water heating industries.

Phi Beta Lambda Gives Back

Four members of GNTC's Phi Beta Lambda chapter volunteered at the Northwest Georgia Branch of the Chattanooga Area Food Bank which supports seven counties in GNTC's service area as well as Fannin and Gilmer counties.



GNTC's Adult Education Program Receives Award

During the 2020 Adult Education Conference and Exceptional Adult Georgian in Literacy Education (EAGLE) Leadership Institute held in Atlanta, GNTC's Adult Education program was awarded the Distinguished Test Center Performance Award by the Technical College System of Georgia. The award reflects the number of GNTC testers who passed all four parts of the GED® test in Fiscal Year 2019. The center saw 628 students complete all four portions of the test during Fiscal Year 19, around a 10 percent increase from the previous year.

GNTC Donates and Transports Ventilators and Medical Supplies to GEMA/HS

As the number of COVID-19 cases continue to rise there has also been an increased demand for medical supplies such as ventilators, hospital masks and gloves. On March 28, Georgia Northwestern Technical College gathered its supply of ventilators used in its Respiratory Care program to donate to the Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency (GEMA/HS). According to Zenia Bratton, director of the Respiratory Care program and assistant dean of Health Technologies at GNTC, the donation of the college's five ventilators came about through a coordinated effort between the Technical College System of Georgia and GEMA/HS. Georgia Northwestern Technical College donated 600 N95 masks and 20,800 gloves said GNTC President Dr. Heidi Popham. Georgia Northwestern Technical College was happy to do its part by utilizing the Commercial Truck Driving program to bring GEMA/HS provided hospital beds to Floyd Medical Center.



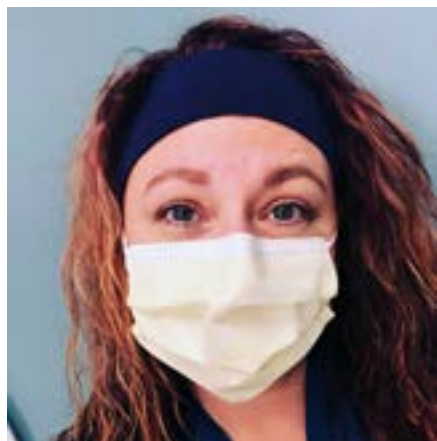
Two GNTC Students Place at Phi Beta Lambda Nationals

"We have so many graduates working in this pandemic," she said.

GNTC Student Designs Desk for Governor's Office

William Rutledge, a Georgia Northwestern Technical College Drafting Technology program student and an employee of Georgia Correctional Industries (GCI), designed a custom wood reception desk that was installed in the Governor's Office at the Georgia State Capitol Building. According to Rutledge, the story of how he ended up designing furniture to go into government buildings started during his 17-year prison sentence. It was while he was incarcerated that he began teaching himself AutoCAD®, a computer-based software program that aids in drafting and designing. Now the 56-year-old is starting a new journey in education at GNTC. His goal is to graduate with an associate degree and continue his work as an employee of GCI.



GNTC's Tatiana Edwards Named President of GSGA

The Georgia Student Government Association (GSGA) recently announced that Georgia Northwestern Technical College student Tatiana Edwards would lead the organization as president during the 2020-21 year. 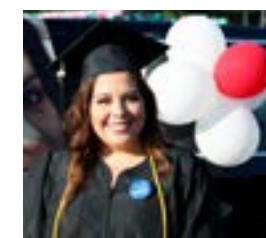


GNTC Student Receives \$5,000 Scholarship from Delta Air Lines

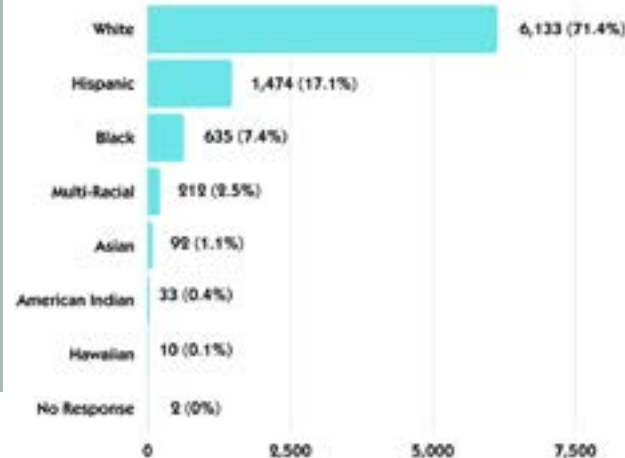

Race and Ethnicity

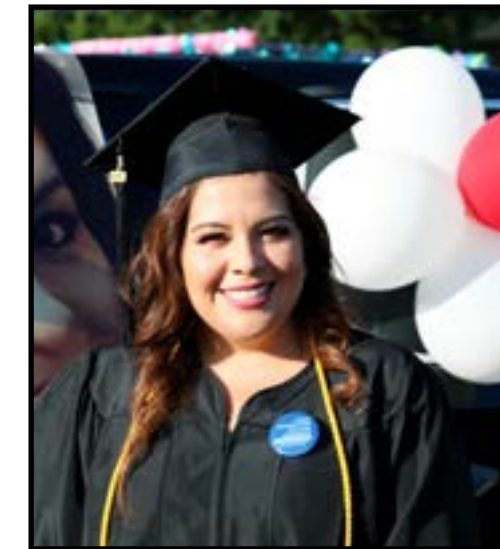

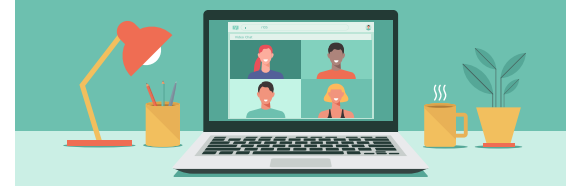

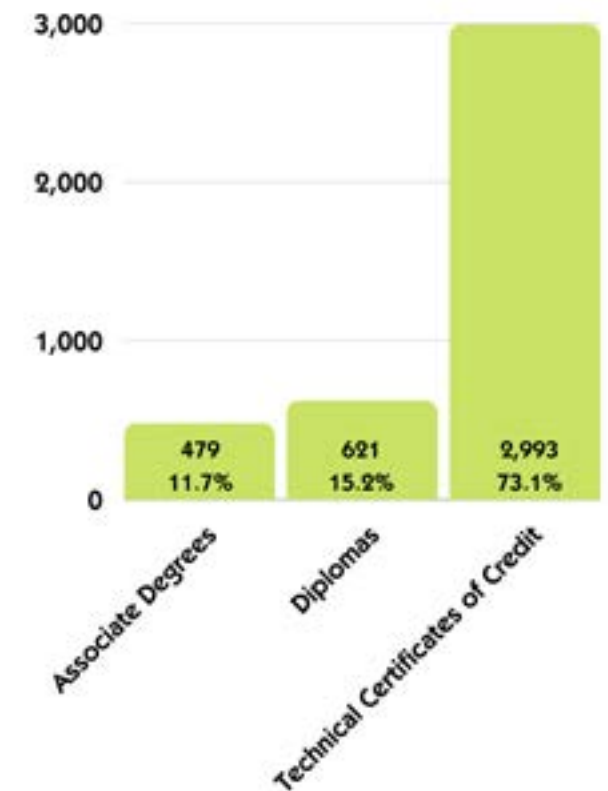

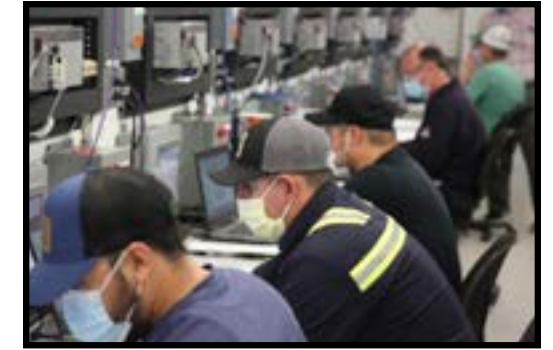
