Business Expansion Center

The Business Expansion Center housed 13 businesses totaling 55 (full and part time) employees.

Georgia Fatherhood Program

The Georgia Fatherhood Program enrolled **160 participants**. **Sixty-two** of those participants enrolled in Adult Education programs and **55** were placed in credit programs at GNTC.

Special Populations

Special Populations at GNTC made contact with **over 1,252 students**. Approximately **717** participated in activities on each GNTC campus. The Lending Library provided over **535** GNTC students with books.

Workforce Investment Act

GNTC Workforce Investment ACT (WIA) assisted **379** dislocated workers with retraining for new careers. WIA provided **\$634,007** in financial resources and benefits for low-income students to train for occupations that allow them to become financially self-sufficient.

Georgia Northwestern Technical College was established in July 2009 from the merger of Coosa Valley Technical College (CVTC) and Northwestern Technical College (NTC). In the first year of operation as a merged college GNTC served a record breaking 23,383 students. With an annual credit enrollment of 9,795 students, GNTC is the largest college in Northwest Georgia and the fifth largest technical college in the state of Georgia. GNTC has an additional enrollment of approximately 13,588 people through adult education, continuing education, business and industry training, and Georgia Quick Start.

Serving the seven counties of Catoosa, Chattooga, Dade, Floyd, Gordon, Polk, and Walker, GNTC has four convenient campus locations in Floyd, Gordon, Polk, and Walker counties. With over 200 programs of study in business, health, industrial, and public service available, students have the opportunity to earn a degree, diploma, or a certificate from GNTC.

Georgia Northwestern Technical College also has a variety of noncredit options available through the Office of Economic Development including continuing education courses, business and industry training courses, Georgia Work Ready Certification, and Georgia Quick Start. Through GNTC's Office of Adult Education, students can enroll in GED classes, assess their skills in various academic areas, learn English as a second language, and take the Work Keys Assessments for the Georgia Work Ready program.

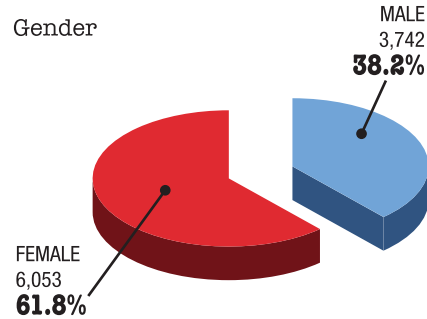

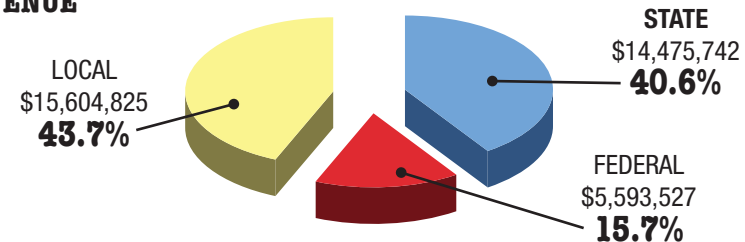
