Northwestern By The County

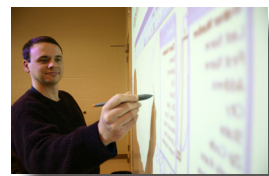
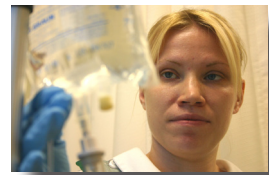
Catoosa



904 students from Catoosa County were served by Northwestern Technical College during Fiscal Year 2008. Additionally, 84 were enrolled in non-credit courses at NTC. 551 students were served by our Adult Literacy Program which is housed in 13 different locations across our four-county service area.

Students in Catoosa County may also take some courses online, as well as at the Catoosa County Adult Learning Center, Ringgold, and Lakeview-Fort Oglethorpe High School.

Chattooga



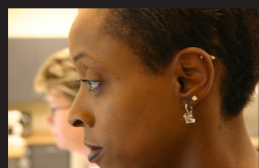
504 students from Chattooga County were served by Northwestern Technical College during Fiscal Year 2008. Additionally, 34 were enrolled in non-credit courses at NTC. 300 students were served by our Adult Literacy Program which is housed in 13 different locations across our four-county service area.

Students in Chattooga County may also take some courses online, as well as at Chattooga County High School and Hays State Prison.

Dade

214 students from Dade County were served by Northwestern Technical College during Fiscal Year 2008. Additionally, 18 were enrolled in non-credit courses at NTC. 145 students were served by our Adult Literacy Program which is housed in 13 different locations across our four-county service area.

Students in Dade County may also take some courses online, as well as at Dade County High School and Dade Elementary.



Walker

1,569 students from Walker County were served by Northwestern Technical College during Fiscal Year 2008. Additionally, 302 were enrolled in non-credit courses at NTC. 409 students were served by our Adult Literacy Program which is housed in 13 different locations across our four-county service area.

Students in Walker County may also take some courses online, as well as at Walker State Prison, Ridgeland, and LaFayette High School.



NTC SUCCESS

Northwestern Technical College is a unit of the Technical College System of Georgia. The TCSG consists of 37 technical colleges and divisions across the state. Currently, NTC graduates enjoy a 98.7% placement rate. Because what you get from your college should be more than a cap, gown, and a piece of paper. At NTC, you receive the career of your dreams from a faculty and staff that can make that a reality.

Graduates at NTC

766 unduplicated graduates earned their degree, diploma, or certificate from Northwestern Technical College in Fiscal Year 2008. NTC issued 1,204 awards to students.

NTC produced 5.4% more graduates in Fiscal Year 2007 than produced in Fiscal Year 2004.

63.4% of NTC graduates earned a Technical Certificate of Credit.

22.8% of NTC graduates earned a Diploma.

13.9% of NTC graduates earned an Associate's Degree.

Graduates in Fiscal Year 2008 earned their awards from one of four program areas.

230 students earned their awards in Health Sciences.

218 students earned their awards in Industrial Technology.

176 students earned their awards in Business & Information Technology.

150 students earned their awards in Human Services.
