The Business Management program is designed to cover the major aspects of business, management, and supervision necessary to advance and succeed in business and industry. Course work covers the basic management skills with emphasis on human relations, leadership, and oral and written communications specifically related to managerial/supervisory positions. It is designed to meet the needs of those who plan to prepare for supervisory positions or advance their current career.

The increasing number of computers in homes and the growing dependence upon computers in business has created a demand for specialists to provide support for users and computers. Computer Support Specialist will provide assistance and training to users and will be trained troubleshooters who provide technical support for hardware, software, and computer systems. Computer Support Specialist may work on a help desk where they assist users who are calling in seeking technical help or they may work as technicians to install, modify, clean, and repair computer hardware and software.

Criminal Justice

Criminal Justice Technology prepares individuals for a career in public service. Students learn the criminal justice system, criminal laws, methods of crime scene search, collection and preservation of evidence, rules of custody, testimony and courtroom procedures, issues relating to juvenile justice, corrections, and police / community relations.

Electronics Technology

The electronics Technology program is a sequence of courses designed to prepare students for careers in electronics professions. The program emphasizes a combination of electronics technology theory and practical application necessary for successful employment using both manual and computerized electronics systems. Program graduates receive an Electronics Technology associate of science degree which qualifies them as electronics technicians with a specialization in industrial electronics. The Electronics Technology program is taught in conjunction with the Industrial Systems Technology program.

Industrial Systems Technology

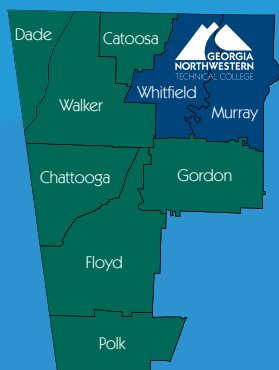

The Industrial Systems Technology diploma program is designed for the student who wishes to prepare for a career as an industrial systems technician/electrician. The program provides learning opportunities that introduce, develop, and reinforce academic and technical knowledge, skills, and attitudes required for job acquisition, retention, and advancement. Additionally, the program provides opportunities to retrain or upgrade present knowledge and skill. The diploma program teaches skills in industrial systems technology providing background skills in several areas of industrial maintenance including electronics, industrial wiring, electric motors, industrial controls, PLCs, HMI's, instrumentation, fluid power, mechanical, pumps and piping, and computers. Graduates of the program receive an Industrial Systems Technology diploma that qualifies them for employment as industrial electricians, industrial systems technicians, or I and E technicians. The Industrial Systems program is taught in conjunction with the Electronics Technology program.
