GNTC Foundation



The Georgia Northwestern Technical College (GNTC) Foundation is a non-profit organization whose primary mission is to support students financially so that they can stay on course, graduate and enter the workforce. Ongoing fundraising enables the Foundation to carry out this mission. Donations are used to provide scholarships to outstanding students, emergency and

gap financial assistance, program support, property and equipment purchases and faculty/staff development.

GNTC's Impact for 2022

- Over \$160,000 in scholarships and financial assistance was awarded to 482 students in Fiscal Year 2022.
- GNTC Foundation scholarships were awarded to 127 students totaling \$59,700.
- GNTC High School Graduate scholarships totaling approximately \$26,274 were awarded to 42 students.
- Emergency and gap funding grants of over \$70,500 were awarded to 232 students.
- High school equivalency testing fees of over \$8,000 supported 81 students.

Fueling Their Education

Soaring inflation was hurting our most vulnerable students, especially when it came to fuel costs. In response, the GNTC Foundation launched Fuel Their Education, a five-day internal giving campaign to raise funds for urgently needed gas cards. The campaign raised over \$10,000, exceeding its goal by \$7,000.


Shannon Edwards is GNTC's Winner of 2022 EAGLE Award

Renee Robertson, of Chatsworth, began Georgia Northwestern Technical College's Industrial Systems Technology program with one goal in mind, to earn more money. Robertson achieved a new level of financial security and was recently promoted to a maintenance technician position at Roper Corporation. "My whole life has changed because of the education I gained at GNTC," Robertson said. The 39-year-old mom was not a traditional Industrial Systems Technology student. "The entire three years I was in the program, there had only been two other women," Robertson said. "I was the first female to complete the apprenticeship program at GNTC with Roper." GNTC's apprenticeship program with Roper Corporation began during the 2017-18 academic year. During her time in the apprenticeship program, Robertson said she gained hands-on experience under veteran iourneymen.



GNTC Receives \$20,000 Gene Haas Foundation Grant

Georgia Northwestern Technical College's Precision Machining and Manufacturing programs on the Floyd County Campus and Whitfield Murray Campus were presented with a \$20,000 grant by the Gene Haas Foundation to be used for student scholarships. The scholarships will be given to students that plan to enroll, or are currently enrolled, in a machining-based program at GNTC. The funds will be used for scholarships and to help pay for students' textbooks or supplies.



Rutledge and Resch 2022 GOAL and Rick Perkins Award Winners for GNTC

Georgia Northwestern Technical College announced Drafting Technology student William Robert Rutledge as its 2022 Georgia Occupational Award of Leadership (GOAL) winner and Crista Resch, director of Ultrasound programs and instructor of Vascular Sonography, as the college's 2022 Rick Perkins Instructor of the Year. The winners were named during a ceremony on GNTC's Gordon County Campus in Calhoun. The Rome Floyd Chamber, the Seven Hills Rotary Club of Rome and GNTC sponsored the awards. Both competed in the state competition in April, where Resch was named a finalist for the TCSG 2022 Rick Perkins Award.

Blevins named GNTC's Adult Education Teacher of the Year

Melissa Blevins, lead teacher and site manager for Adult Education in Gordon County, was named Georgia Northwestern Technical College's Adult Education Teacher of the Year for 2022. Georgia Northwestern Technical College graduate Hannah Beth Reeves probably never dreamed her career teaching small children would lead to her recognition as Georgia's Early Childhood Educator of the Year for preschool. Reeves graduated in spring 2019 with a certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education Basics and a 4.0 GPA. She was selected as the preschool winner for the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning and Georgia Foundation for Early Care + Learning Georgia Early Childhood Educator of the Year for 2021-22.



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GNTC students take top honors at SkillsUSA Georgia 2022 and Skills USA Nationals 2022

Georgia Northwestern Technical College students had an outstanding performance at the 2022 SkillsUSA Georgia State Leadership and Skills Conference, Feb. 24-26, in Atlanta. GNTC competed in 10 categories and took home 11 medals: four gold, four silver and three bronze. Highlights from SkillsUSA Georgia include winning the gold and silver medal in Medical Assisting, winning the silver and bronze awards in Automotive Service Technology and winning the gold medal in the TeamWorks team construction category for the sixth year in a row. At the SKillsUSA National State Leadership and Skills Conference, June 21-24, GNTC brought home two national medals, a bronze in Medical Assisting and a silver in the TeamWorks team construction category.





Students Compete at State and National PBL Competition

Three Georgia Northwestern Technical College students placed in their competitions at the Phi Beta Lambda (PBL) State Competition in Atlanta. Students competed in eight events and finished with three first place finishes, three second place finishes and two third place finishes. Aixa Rodriguez, one of the first place finishers, went on to compete at PBL Nationals in Chicago.



GNTC Named Murray Chamber Innovator of the Year

The Murray County Chamber of Commerce selected Georgia Northwestern Technical College as its 2022 Innovator of the Year. The Chamber's Executive Team and Board of Directors chair select "a Chamber member business who goes above and beyond their daily process or routine to build impact" to receive the award, said Eli Falls, president and CEO of the Murray Chamber and the Industrial Development Authority. GNTC was selected due to the partnership and willingness to create the Murray Works Employment Academy, which caters to workforce recruitment needs of local large employers and is focused on graduating high school students. The award was presented at the Chamber's annual meeting.



GNTC & Georgia Power Create Lineworker Training Program

Leaders from Georgia Power joined with officials from the Technical College System of Georgia, Georgia Northwestern Technical College and state and local representatives at GNTC's Polk County Campus in Rockmart to announce the newest program in Georgia to support training and education for future lineworkers. Through a new collaboration between Georgia Power and GNTC, students will benefit from a robust training program including donated equipment such as bucket trucks, power poles and climbing equipment, as well as hands-on expertise from Georgia Power as the college develops curriculum and training for the program. Students will also have the opportunity to earn a Restricted Class A Commercial Driver's License (CDL) through the program.





Resource Centers Available on all Six GNTC Campuses

Georgia Northwestern Technical College has opened Resource Centers on all six campuses to assist Special Populations students. Daizha Staples, Special Populations coordinator at GNTC, manages the new program, which operates through the Office of Student Success. She also oversees all of GNTC's food pantries and clothing closets. The resources are available on the Catoosa, Floyd, Gordon, Polk, Walker and Whitfield Murray Campuses.



Concrete Fiber Company Cements Partnership with GNTC through Apprentice Internships

The Dual Enrollment program at Georgia Northwestern Technical College and Catoosa County's From HERE to CAREER! College and Career Academy has cemented a partnership with an area manufacturer of concrete reinforcement fiber. Sika Corp.'s Chattanooga plant makes concrete reinforcement fibers from polypropylene. Plant leadership said they participate in GNTC's internship program to nurture the upcoming workforce and to provide a community service. Sika's two interns completed Catoosa County's From HERE to CAREER! Academy's mechatronics pathway, graduated from high school last year and are working towards their associate degrees in Industrial Systems Technology through GNTC. Zaniel Carroll, 18, went to work for Sika as a maintenance intern about a year ago while 19-year-old Connor Hutchins was hired four months ago; they both work 28 hours per week and attend classes two nights a week.

Georgia Northwestern Technical College has named Lisa Pearson, Student Success Coach at GNTC's Walker County Campus in Rock Spring, as its 2022 ROSE Award winner. The Recognizing Outstanding Staff Effectiveness (ROSE) Award recognizes technical college staff who make a significant contribution to the college and to technical education.



Leadership Dalton-Whitfield 2022 Class Donates to GNTC

The Leadership Dalton-Whitfield 2022 class has outfitted 12 Georgia Northwestern Technical College Diesel Equipment Technology students with the basic tools they need to jumpstart their careers. Murray Works Employment Academy Holds Graduation

Three women and five men became the first students to graduate from the Murray Works Employment Academy. The 10-day bootcamp caters to workforce recruitment needs of local large employers. It is focused on equipping graduates of high schools in Murray County, with no post-secondary plans, with the knowledge and skills to fill entry-level manufacturing jobs that become high-quality, high-performing manufacturing careers. "The program covers topics designed to prepare students for jobs with local manufacturers, such as a history of the floorcovering industry and its technological developments, Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) 10-Hour General Industry Training, forklift operator awareness training, warehousing skills and Excel Level 1 training," said Eli Falls, president and CEO of the Murray County Chamber of Commerce and the Industrial Development Authority. The students completed 64 hours of training during the bootcamp.





GNTC Foundation Announced Two Scholarships

McDaniel Family Scholarship: Georgia Northwestern Technical College announced a new scholarship program for graduating seniors from high schools in Murray County. Alexa Pacheco has been selected as the first recipient of the \$5,000 McDaniel Family Scholarship, founded in memory of Carlton and Henrietta McDaniel. The scholarship was established to support graduating seniors from Murray County High School or North Murray High School.

Judge Winn Scholarship: The family of late Tallapoosa Judicial Circuit Superior Court Judge Dan Peace Winn has established a second scholarship at Georgia Northwestern Technical College. The family's newly-established Dan Winn Adult Education Scholarship will support Adult Education students on the Polk County Campus for years to come. 




