## ARTICULATION OF TRANSFER AGREEMENT

Bryan College (BC) and Georgia Northwestern Technical College (GNTC) hereby enter into a partnership that promotes academic opportunity for students through this transfer and program articulation agreement. This academic alliance allows transfer of Associate of Applied Science degrees in Business Management and related transfer of curriculum credit from GNTC to BC AGS. This agreement is to be reviewed and revised, if necessary, by representatives of both partner institutions.

Students who are conferred the AAS will be granted junior status upon entering the BBA or BSAP program at BC in AGS and will be awarded at least sixty (60) hours of transfer credit. BC will apply up to seventy-six (76) hours described herein toward the bachelor's degree. Credits will first be applied to fulfill general education requirements (except Bible requirements). Additional credit hours transferred from GNTC beyond the required sixty (60) hour minimum will be applied as additional elective credit hours towards the 124-hour Bachelor degree requirement at the discretion of the registrar at BC.

Official transcripts will be required for transfer of credit. Transfer students must meet the entrance requirements for the program. They must have an accumulative grade point average of 2.0 (c) or higher. Transfer courses must not duplicate other courses for which credit has been awarded. Developmental or pre-college courses are not accepted for transfer. A maximum of twelve (12) credit hours of GNTC Internship Education courses may be transferred as elective credit.

To encourage GNTC graduates to complete a 4-year bachelor degree program through AGS at BC, the following incentives are being offered:

- A **\$1,000 Scholarship** will be awarded to all GNTC graduates with an AAS in Business Management who meet the entrance requirements and enroll in AGS at BC. The scholarship award will be divided over the first three semesters of study.
- A **\$1,000 Scholarship** will be awarded to any full-time GNTC staff or faculty member or spouse of a staff or faculty member who wishes to complete an undergraduate or graduate degree in AGS at BC and meets the entrance requirements for their respective program. This scholarship award will be provided at the time of enrollment and will be divided over the first three semesters of study.
