Accelerated Phlebotomy Technician Certificate Planning Notes:

- This program is one semester. All classes listed in the suggested courses are the pre-occupational & occupational courses that must be taken to meet graduation requirements.
- The Phlebotomy program requires a waitlist application. Contact Program Advisor, Tracey Mercado, tmercado@gntc.edu, for more info.
- The Phlebotomy program accepts students twice yearly:
 - Fall on the Floyd County Campus.
 - Spring on Walker County Campus.
- This pathway has limited financial aid options available (may only qualify for HOPE Grant). Please discuss the options available to you with Financial Aid.

Accelerated Phlebotomy Technician Certificate Enrollment Requirements:

- Students must have a 2.0 to enter the program or no GPA. The student must have a 2.0 GPA to meet the graduation requirements, and any starting GPA lower than 2.0 will not be able to graduate and receive a diploma. Students will not be accepted without meeting those requirements.
- For students who do not meet the GPA requirement, it is suggested to take pre-occupational curriculum (core classes) to improve their GPA to meet program entry requirements. Programs that may be of interest or provide pre-occupational curriculum are Phlebotomy Technician (PT21) Certificate or Health Care Assistant (HA21) Certificate.
