Construction Management Diploma Program Planning Notes:

- Occupational courses for this program are offered at the Gordon County Campus.
- This program begins every other fall semester; however, students can begin *any* semester and should take the course set offered during the semester they enter. Students beginning this program in a:
 - Fall semester - should take classes in the 1st or 4th set of suggested courses, depending on which set is currently offered.
 - Spring semester – should take classes in the 2nd or 5th set of suggested courses, depending on which set is currently offered.
 - Summer semester - should take Basic Skills Courses as program specific courses are not offered in summer semester.

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
