Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Certificate Planning Notes:

- Classes for this Certificate are offered at the Catoosa County Campus, Floyd County Campus, and Gordon County Campus. Schedules may vary by campus.
- Students must submit an Eligibility Form request and be accepted into the Emergency Medical Technician Certification program.
- Students will need to take all courses as ordered in each set of suggested courses complete the program. Partial enrollment of courses is not permitted.
- All programs are 24/28 shift friendly.
- Students must attend a program specific orientation before the start of EMSP courses.

Fall/ Spring Course Offerings

- Fall program start Catoosa offers program courses in the evenings. Floyd offers program courses during the day, which meets on a rotating 24/48 schedule.
- Spring program start Courses follow the same suggested courses as Fall semester. Program is offered only at GCC in the evenings.

EMT Certificate / AEMT Certificate / PHEMS Certificate

- This pathway is to be used for students wishing to receive an EMT Certificate. Once a student starts the EMT program the program must be completed without any breaks.
- EMT students have the opportunity to continue into the AEMT program. To complete the EMT & AEMT programs during the same program path, students should follow the Pre-Hospital EMS Operations (PE01) Certificate eMap. Completing both the EMT & AEMT courses qualifies for the PHEMS Certificate.
- Students already certified as an EMT wishing to receive only the AEMT certificate should see the AEMT Certificate eMap.
