- Courses for this Certificate are offered at the Floyd County Campus and Gordon County Campus. Schedules for each campus may vary.
- NAST 2100 is an 8-week course, but ALHS course may run the full semester.
- A social security card and state issued identification card are required.
- Subject to Background Check and Drug Screening; possibility of fingerprinting.
- High School diploma or GED is not required to enter or graduate from this program.
- Students may enroll in this program at age 17 as long as they are not a dual enrollment student.
- Accelerated program may only be eligible for HOPE Grant.
