Advanced Emergency Medical Technician Program Notes:

- Classes for this Certificate are offered at the Floyd County Campus, and Gordon County Campus. Schedules may vary by campus.
- Students must submit an Eligibility Form request and be accepted into the Advanced Emergency Medical Technician Certification program.
- To enroll directly into the AEMT Program, students must be a certified or licensed EMT.
- Students beginning the program in Spring semester must register no later than the drop/add deadline for Spring-Term A. Program courses will begin in mid-late Spring semester (Spring-Term C) and will finish the program in summer semester.
- Curriculum must be taken as ordered in each set of suggested courses, based on starting semester, to complete the program. Partial enrollment of courses is not permitted.
