Nursing (ASN) Admission Notes:

Admission Requirements

All applicants to the PN program must meet the following requirements:

- 1) Be 17 or more years of age.
- 2) Be an officially accepted and current student with the college.
- 3) Email your Nursing advisor. Students are assigned advisors based on the first letter of the student's last name:

- 4) Submit a RN Eligibility Request Form when finished with your pre-occupational classes: <https://www.gntc.edu/rn-eligibility/>.
- 5) Successfully complete the pre-requisites and pass the pre-admission exam.
- 6) All students interested in the ASN Program must attend a mandatory group advisement session once they have officially been accepted by the college and have chosen Nursing. Dates and times can be found on the [RN Department Website](#).
- 7) Math and science courses must be current within 5 years.

Class Acceptance

The ASN program is a competitive admission program. ASN classes are accepted once a year during the fall semester. Class acceptance is based on a point* system consisting of the pre-occupational curriculum grades and the HESI pre-admission scores.

The program requires a GPA of 3.0 or higher on the pre-occupational curriculum as well as passing all sections of the HESI pre-admission exam. Therefore, students will want to strive for higher scores in the pre-occupational curriculum and on the HESI pre-admission exam.

Once accepted into the program, it will take a student under two years to complete.

*Additional points will be added to the admission score for students who hold a currently valid Healthcare degree, certificate, or license.

Deadlines Dates:

If you wish to be considered for the Fall ASN class that begins in August, you must have **ALL** the pre-occupational curriculum completed, as well as the HESI pre-admission exam and your group advisement attendance by **June 15th** of that year.
