- Students must submit an Eligibility Form request and be accepted into the program.
- If accepted into the program, information regarding a required program specific orientation will be sent out with the acceptance letter.
- Occupational Curriculum must be taken as ordered in each set of suggested courses to complete the program. Partial enrollment of courses is not permitted.
- All math and science courses must be current within 5 years.
