





MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN GEORGIA NORTHWESTERN TECHNICAL COLLEGE, DALTON STATE COLLEGE AND GEORGIA HIGHLANDS COLLEGE

This Agreement is entered into by and between Georgia Northwestern Technical College (hereinafter referred to as "GNTC"), Dalton State College (hereinafter referred to as "DSC"), and Georgia Highlands College (hereinafter referred to as "GHC"). The objectives of the Agreement are to provide a partnership between GNTC, DSC, and GHC that will allow students to enroll at GNTC, complete one of the articulated associate degrees included in the Appendices and meet all admission requirements to be eligible to enroll in one of the corresponding BS degrees at DSC or GHC according to the pathways provided in the Appendices. Pathways may be added, removed, or revised in this agreement upon consent of all parties.

The objectives of the Agreement are to facilitate access to educational opportunities in Northwest Georgia.

The parties hereto agree as follows:

I. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- A. The Academic Deans of the respective programs at GNTC, DSC, and GHC, or their appointed representatives, will cooperate closely to maintain academic requirements for the Agreement to the extent permitted by governing authorities and accreditation standards for each institution. For curriculum and course changes, each institution will work with the other party to maintain the requirements of both this Agreement and academic programs.
- B. The transfer of credits is consistent with and subject to the conditions prescribed in each institution's published catalog and the time of the student's transfer request.
- C. Transfer courses must be taken while GNTC is SACSCOC accredited.

- D. Candidates must successfully complete the respective Associate's Degree at GNTC.
- E. Candidates must successfully meet all requirements to gain admission to DSC or GHC.
- F. Transfer students must complete all coursework in their respective degree plan of study before receiving their bachelor's degree from DSC or GHC.
- G. Completion of an Associate's Degree at GNTC does not guarantee admission to a competitive program at DSC or GHC. Candidates must successfully meet all requirements for program admission.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF GNTC

- A. Support activities twice per year to facilitate DSC and GHC recruiting personnel to contact and/or meet with GNTC students interested in transferring to DSC or GHC under the auspices of this Agreement.
- B. Upon a candidate's completion of a respective Associate's Degree at GNTC, the candidate's transcript will be sent free of charge to DSC and/or GHC upon request.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF DSC

- A. Upon a candidate's completion of a respective Associate's Degree at GNTC, the candidate's application fee to DSC will be waived.
- B. Accept all pre-approved courses for transfer as listed in the Appendices of this Agreement.
- C. Upon a candidate's completion of a respective Bachelor's Degree at DSC, the candidate's transcript will be sent free of charge to GNTC upon request for reverse transfer of credit.

IV. RESPONSIBILITIES OF GHC

- A. Upon a candidate's completion of a respective Associate's Degree at GNTC, the candidate's application fee to GHC will be waived.
- B. Accept all pre-approved courses for transfer as listed in the Appendices of this Agreement.
- C. Upon a candidate's completion of a respective Bachelor's Degree at GHC, the candidate's transcript will be sent free of charge to GNTC upon request for reverse transfer of credit.

V. JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES

A. Each party will notify the other of any changes in the curricula, degree requirements, and admission requirements.

- B. Share in responsibilities pursuant to this Agreement regarding recruiting, placement, and advising current and future students.
- C. Agree to hold institutional meetings, at a minimum, biannually to discuss activities and efforts related to this Agreement.

VI. TERM AND TERMINATION

- A. This Agreement will commence on December 16, 2024, and will continue to be valid until amended, modified, or terminated. The Agreement will be reviewed every three years or as needed to either make necessary revisions or to be terminated. No party shall be bound by this Agreement until it is signed by appropriate officials representing the three institutions on the signature page of this Agreement.
- B. The Agreement may be terminated by a party by written notification at least six (6) months prior to the desired termination date.
